ABOUT THE PROJECT AND PROGRAM

AIM OF THE PROJECT:

The project "The European Union – Yesterday, Today, Tomorrow" aims to raise awareness of the history of the European Union and to show the benefits of EU membership, especially for young people. Thanks to the participation of organizations from countries with different experience of European integration (Italy – founding member), Poland (member since 2004), North Macedonia (candidate country), young people will learn about different perspectives of integration and approaches to the Union itself. What is equally important, our actions will not take place in large cities but in smaller locations, so we can reach people who have limited access to information.

A number of actions are planned under the project: 3 events entitled "EU Festival" in each partner country with debates; table discussions; European workshops for young people; the European Union knowledge contest and the presentation of youth works. In addition to young people, representatives of all partner countries, external experts, local authorities, lecturers and seniors will participate in the meetings.

A conference summarizing the project will be held at the end of the project. The works prepared by young people in the "I-European" competition will be the primary result of its implementation. All works will be translated into English and presnented on the Internet websites. Winners of individual competitions will go abroad to specific events with partners. In addition a brochure summarizing the project will be produced at the end of the project. It will be sent to the most important people and institutions of culture, local authorities, politicians, etc.

DAY 1

1st day








12:00

Simulation Game – The Referendum.

A Simulation Game is a method that simulates and simplifies a complex real-life situation and its processes in a role play. The aim of a simulation game is to give the participants an insight into the problems and relations of a real-life situation. They should be encouraged to take different points of view and to reflect on their own decisions and actions. They provide a secure setting for participants to try out how to act or react in a new role and to reflect on the consequences of their behavior. Simulations are often used in business education and training as well as in political education.

The participants were divided into 5 international groups
– 4 political parties with different perspectives and the 5th additional group was the voting society.

They were representing:

- Diversity
- Populist
- Urban
- Traditionalist













The political parties were responsible for preparing political campaigns and delivering their point of view, to the voters – citizens can answer the Referendum questions:

Should the age of voting be lowered or lifted?
Can young people affect change in their community?

The Referendum allows citizens, through the petition process, to refer acts to the ballot before they become law. The referendum also permits acts for approval or rejection during voting. The primary purpose of the Referendum is to give voters an opportunity to approve or reject laws either proposed or enacted by the Parties. The groups were talking about initial thoughts per party and working on campaigns for their opinion. Their aim was to encourage the group of voting society

After the presentations of the campaigns, the results of the referendum question were: not to lower the age of voting. The electorate decided that the law should not been changed, as a matter of education, the level of sensitivity of youth and their own will.











DAY 3





















Above the bidding agenda, during the whole project, we were talking about the current situation in the world.

Debating our few perspectives on European security, lead us to the conversations about the future of the European Union. We formulated casual scenarios and share our feelings.

In light of Russian aggression on Ukraine, it is crucial for European countries to work together and support each other as the Union does. Especially when North Macedonia is one of seven current candidate countries waiting for accession to the European Union.

This project allowed me to know more about a country which wished to enter European Union, and it allowed me also to realize the benefits I have as an European citizen













Helena from North Macedonia:

Some time ago, I had the opportunity to be part of the project "The EU: yesterday, today, tommorow" that took place in Shtip, Macedonia. There were participants from Macedonia, Poland and Italy and we discussed about several topics such as how we see the development of EU in the future, what are Its advandages and disadvantages etc.. Furthermore we had an "election" activity where we split in four parties that had different values and morals and each party had to gain a vote from the "citizens".
